Motion to approve minutes from the September 12th Regular Meeting by Zach Jackson. 2nd by Yvonne Sharrow. Approved: 6-0. NO Meeting in October. Receipts and Expenditures YTD through October 31st reviewed.

Continuation of Business:

1. 2023 Fees Schedule Recommendations:

a. Pavilions:

- i. Remove Nature Park Pavilion until repairs and improvements are made. Hazardous.
- **ii.** \$25 security deposit for EHT Residents and Township Non-profits, for all pavilions.

b. Sports Fields (at Youth Sports Complex):

- *Current:* \$3/field/hour for *resident and non-resident. \$100 deposit.
 Suggested: \$5/field/hour for *resident and \$10/field/hour non-resident.
 \$100 deposit.
- ii. *Current:* Special events/tournaments- Same fee structure as field rentals. *Suggested:* \$125/field/day for *resident; \$250/field/day non-resident. \$500 deposit.

*Resident is based on residency in Lower Dauphin SD >50%.

Perhaps we need a separate contract for tournaments and special events with emphasis on clean-up, repair, maintenance.

NOTE: The sports fields by the EH Elementary School (part of the Nature Park) are under a separate contract.

c. Summer Recreation Camp:

- i. *Current timeline:* 6 weeks: 6/27 8/5 *Suggested:* 7 weeks: 6/19 - 8/4
- ii. *Current* Rate per child: *Resident:* \$25/week; *Suggested:* N/C. *Non-resident current:* \$30/week; *Suggested:* \$35/week.
- iii. Attendance: *Currently:* Up to 60. *Suggested:* Inc. to 80? Becky to check on actual cost/child.

2. Youth Sports Complex portable toilet.

- a. Fee increased for 2023. \$138 currently through Walters Septic.
- b. Becky received a proposal from Tillets Toilets. Less money.
- c. Remove the unit from the Sports Complex for winter. Return it in March 2023?
- d. Potentially remove all port a potties except for the one at the Community Park, for rest of the year and return them in March, 2023 for seasonal use.

3. Youth Sports Complex Sign.

- a. Review design options from Stoner Graphix.
- b. Suggested: a design similar to the Nature Park sign.

4. Schedule of 2023 Events & Programming.

- a. Review ideas and make suggestions.
- b. Make sure we have enough volunteers to assist.
- c. Consider corporate sponsorships to offset costs and provide additional volunteers.

5. PA Master Naturalist course.

- a. April May, 2023.
- b. Was cancelled this year due to lack of interest.
- c. Potentially a multi-year agreement through 2026?

6. Geocells for the Main Park.

- a. Can be installed on trails to help alleviate ponding.
- b. Purchase to use up rest of funds in a donation to the Nature Park.
- c. 9' X 16' sections.

Old Business:

- 1. **Meadow Conversion Project** completed October 20th. Positive feedback. Good attendance from local municipalities.
- 2. Fall festival went well. Purchase more pumpkins next year. No movie.
- 3. **Pavilion Restrooms** Submitted Permit with Light Heigle, will use funds under Capital Improvements for 2022, about \$4k to make them ADA compliant.
- 4. Getting final **quotes for grass/ turf maintenance** in 2023.
- 5. Updates on **Gaming grants**, purchases, tool cat.
- 6. Plan preparations for **Community Park Redevelopment Project** to go to DCNR for approval.
- 7. Reviewing existing **short and long-term goals** with Parks & Recreation Board. Perhaps at next meeting.
- 8. **Senior Programming for 2023**. Becky working with Autumn Leaves and seniors to schedule programming for their luncheons.

- Redo tennis courts.
- Repair and renovate pavilion at the Nature Park.
- Connect the northern and southern sides of the Main Park with a box culvert bridge.
- Connect the Main Park with the Nature Park in a safe manner. Painting crosswalk on Old Jonestown Rd., etc. (needs twp. ordinance for crosswalk starts with lee, requires traffic study in house)
