### 2022/2023 DAUPHIN COUNTY GAMING GRANTS AWARDED

East Hanover Township has been awarded \$685,000 in 2022/2023 Dauphin County gaming grant funds. The Township requested \$1,025,000 from the County and was awarded roughly two-thirds of this amount for the following projects:

- \$517,000 for paving Township roads
- \$100,000 for replacing and upgrading safety equipment for the Fire Company
- \$50,000 to pay off debt service incurred by the Fire Company for replacing fire hoses and nozzles
- \$18,000 for supplies to convert the Public Works Building into a temporary shelter in case of an emergency or disaster

The Township again received significantly more gaming grant funds than any other municipality. We appreciate the continued cooperation with the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners and the Gaming Advisory Board in securing funds for these worthwhile projects that benefit East Hanover Township.

The following chart shows the Township Building rental rates for East Hanover Township, Dauphin County, residents:

1-50 people	\$75.00	\$25.00	
51-100 people	\$125.00	\$25.00	
101-150 people	\$175.00	\$25.00	
151-200 people	\$225.00	\$25.00	

Each rental will consist of a base rental period of five (5) hours and may have additional billable hours. A security deposit of \$100.00 is required for each rental. The security deposit will be refunded after a satisfactory inspection of the premises after the event and the return of the rental key. Early setup of the room and tear down time for a rental is considered part of the rental time and will be charged for accordingly. There is a standard fee of \$80.00 for the use of the building by churches and for funeral receptions. A security deposit of \$30.00 is required.





Contact the Park and Recreation Director to rent one of our **Community Park pavilions** at 717-469-0833 x202. We have one pavilion near the Township building (with 10 picnic tables, grill, electric, ADA accessible restrooms, and by the new Inclusive Playground) and one pavilion by the soccer fields in the Youth Sports Complex (with 12 picnic tables and a portable toilet). Parks close at dusk. Restrooms/portable toilets are located near the pavilions and are open seasonally. Reservations require a security deposit that will be refunded following satisfactory compliance with stated rules.

### Rules and Regulations for all Township Parks, Ordinance 2017-03

- All parks are closed from dusk to dawn.
- No open fires or hot coals.
- No hunting or discharging of any guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or any similar items.
- Golfing or golf practice is prohibited.
- Disorderly conduct, the use of profane language, or the consumption of alcoholic beverages or drugs is prohibited.
- Pets are permitted, provided they are on a visible leash not more than 6-feet long, attended at all times, kept off athletic fields and sport courts, and the owner shall clean up all waste from their pets.
- Bicycles are permitted on trails, provided that the riders yield to those walking.
- Smoking and related tobacco products are prohibited within the parks.

## STORMWATER BILLING INFORMATION


The Township has contracted with Dallas Data Systems, a company based in Pottstown, for providing its stormwater billing service. While the Township considered bringing this service "in house", it would have been more costly and less efficient than using an outside provider. Further, the Township Building does not currently have the space for this function. The Township evaluated several billing companies before choosing Dallas Data Systems due to its expertise. This means that, should you have questions about your stormwater bill or if your payment has been received, you can contact Dallas Data Systems at 610-819-6062. Please note that payments cannot be accepted at the East Hanover Township Office.

You may have noticed that the mailing address for your stormwater bill is P.O. Box 462, Pleasant Grove, UT 84062. That is because the bank "lock box" service that Dallas Data System uses for collecting these payments is located in Utah. Payments may also be made by credit card through the Township's online payment partner, Xpress Bill Pay, by visiting https://www.xpressbillpay.com/#/?org=easthanover10882.

- Wash your car on the lawn with phosphate free, non-toxic, biodegradable soap and direct the dirty water away from any storm drains.
- Keep your car properly tuned.
- Recycle used fluids and never dump them down the storm drain.

### **Electronic Recycling**

East Hanover Township has joined forces with Dauphin County Solid Waste Management to facilitate electronics recycling. Accepted devices include answering machines, fax machines, camcorders, CD players, copiers, electric typewriters, laptop and desktop computers, microwave ovens, modems, pagers, printers, radios, remote controls, scanners, stereo equipment including speakers, telephones, televisions, and VCR's.

**Old cellphones** can now be dropped off at the EHT Municipal Building with Electronics Recycling.

Recycle your **empty Inkjet Cartridges** to the Drop-off Box

located in the EHT Municipal Building lobby.

**PLEASE NOTE:** This service is provided to EHT Residents (please bring I.D.), Monday through Friday from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm. You must come into the office to complete the "Recycling Form" (listing your items, if your item has a screen you will need the screen size) and independently load all items into the trailer which is now kept in the building garage. Township employees are unable to assist with lifting. Only complete units will be accepted - NO STRIPPED UNITS.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: Appliances, Tools, Batteries, Light Bulbs, Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Detectors, Medical equipment, Vaccum Cleaners, Heaters, Air Conditioners, etc.

#### **Key Dates:**

May 31st- Last day to pay County Real Estate taxes at face value.

**June 15th-** Last day to pay LDSD Supplemental Personal taxes.

**June 30th-** Last day to pay County and LDSD March Interim Real Estate taxes at face value.

**July 1st-** Lower Dauphin School District Real Estate & Personal tax bills are mailed.

**August 31st-** Last day to pay LDSD Real Estate & Personal taxes at a DISCOUNTED rate.

**Reminder:** All residents 18 years of age or older pay the two-Per Capita taxes (LDSD and EHT)

### LDSD Occupational Tax Exemption Info

There are certain partial exemptions which will remove the Occupation Tax amount only. To claim the exemption, fill out, sign, and return an Exemption Form to the Tax Office.

The forms are also available on www.ldsd.org or www.easthanovertwpdcpa.org/tax-office or at the East Hanover Township Building outside the front door.

Writing notes on the tax bill does not qualify.

Resident must meet any one of the following criteria and submit the Exemption Request Form:

### Occupation Tax Exemption Criteria

(resident must meet any one of the criteria)

Pennsylvania taxable income is or will be less than \$6,000 for the current tax year. If you claim this exemption but find your income has increased beyond the \$6,000 before the end of the year, you must come into the office to pay the Occupation amount. OR

Retired and your only source of income is social security, pension or disability OR

A full-time student of higher education (enrolled in at least 12 credit hours per semester for 2 semesters during July 1 through June 30 of the following year). OR

A member of the clergy with no other occupation. OR

70 years of age or older as of July 1 of the current year.

## Subdivision and Land Development Plans currently under review:

## Walters Services Subdivision and Land Development Plan:

Plan proposes to subdivide a 13.37 acre lot from parcel 25-007-010 (between Ridge Road, Bow Creek Road, and Station Road) and construct a new septic contractor business headquarters which would include three shop buildings, one office building, separate accesses to Ridge Road and Station Road, a parking lot, a stone storage area, utilities, and stormwater management facilities. The property is proposed to be served by a private well and on-lot sewer system. The proposed subdivided lot to be developed is in the Industrial Commercial (IC) zoning district. The plan was accepted for review on February 28, 2023. A review extension was granted and the plan review period currently expires on August 27, 2023.

### North Mill Simple Subdivision Plan:

Plan proposes to subdivide the existing lot of approximately 3.4 acres at 8363 Jonestown Road, Grantville into a northern parcel of approximately 2.1 acres and a southern parcel of approximately 1.3 acres. The parcel is in the Rural Agricultural (RA) zoning district and there are no plans for construction at this time. The plan was accepted for review on April 4, 2023 and the plan review period currently expires on July 3, 2023. No waivers are currently being requested by the applicant.

## Zoning Hearing Board recent decision:

The property owner at 1011 Manada Gap Road, Grantville requested variances from the minimum front yard setback requirement and the restriction on placing an accessory structure in a front yard. The variances were requested due to the slope of the property and were granted by the Zoning Hearing Board on March 20, 2023.

### <u>Bonawitz Real Estate Investors/JLB Construction</u> <u>Subdivision and Land Development Plan:</u>

Plan proposes to subdivide a 7 acre lot from parcel 25-007-010 (between Ridge Road, Bow Creek Road, and Station Road) and construct a new construction business headquarters which would include one 3,000 square foot office building, one 15,000 square foot shop building, access to Ridge Road, parking facilities, paved storage area, a stone storage area, utilities, and stormwater management facilities. The property is proposed to be served by a private well and on-lot sewer system. The proposed subdivided lot to be developed is in the Industrial Commercial (IC) zoning district. The plan was accepted for review on February 28, 2023. A review extension was granted and the plan review period currently expires on August 27, 2023.

### Fasnacht/Brassell Lot Line Revision Plan:

Plan proposes to adjust the location of the shared property line between the properties at 2391 Sand Beach Road and 2403 Sand Beach Road, Grantville. The plan was accepted for review on May 2, 2023 and the plan review period currently expires on July 31, 2023.

# Subdivision and Land Development Plans recently approved/denied:

### <u>Tru of Grantville Simple Subdivision Plan:</u>

Conditional approval was granted on April 18, 2023, for plan to subdivide the 10-acre lot at 252 Bow Creek Road, Grantville into a southern parcel of 3.515 acres and a northern parcel of 6.485 acres. It is located in the Highway Commercial (HC) zoning district and the plan creates separate commercial parcels for the two hotels that are currently on a single parcel. A waiver was also granted from Section 501.B.12 of the Stormwater Management Ordinance to allow an existing underground infiltration bed to be located less than 10 feet from the newly created lot line.

### Rech Solar Land Development Plan:

Plan that proposed to develop an existing lot of approximately 6.5 acres at 153 Pine Road, Palmyra by placing approximately 2,500 solar panels on it was denied on April 18, 2023. The parcel is in the Rural Agricultural (RA) zoning district.

### 2023 Road Work and other Projects

Construction season is here again, and this year Public Works has a full schedule. You may have already seen the Public Works Crew replacing culverts and cleaning them in preparation for paving. The list of roads to be paved are as follows:

- Jonestown Road (from Spring Road west to the Township Line)
- North Meadow Road (from Mill Road to Route 22)
- Samantha Court
- Circle Drive
- The rest of Carlson Road
- A section of Bow Creek Road (from Fox Run Road to Route 443)
- Fox Mill Road

Oil and chipping of roads will also continue throughout the Township this year, as this process prolongs the life of the asphalt pavement until they are paved. There will be 5 to 10 miles of roads oiled and chipped this year.

The East Hanover Township Board of Supervisors and the management team are committed to improving our road system and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Some of our other projects are as follows:

- New school zone flashing lights (to be installed in the next few months)
- Site grading for the new playground
- Stormwater/MS4 work (replacing old metal culvert pipes throughout the Township)
- Site grading for the new amphitheater
- Crack sealing of roads

# EAST HANOVER TOWNSHIP OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Now that summer is just around the corner, we are all anxious to spend more time outdoors with family and friends.

We normally think of it as a peaceful and serene time of year, but we cannot forget that some of our most destructive weather events may occur over the summer months.

Hurricane season will be starting June 1st and continuing until November 30th. And although we are usually not in the direct path of hurricanes, we are susceptible to hurricane remnants such as tropical storms or depressions. These events may bring very windy conditions and may leave inches of rainfall behind. And let's not forget those sudden thunderstorm events that may be short lasting but can be destructive as well.

The first thing is to prepare yourself by getting weather alerts through various media outlets, either over a telephone or weather alert radio. It also means securing those outside objects in advance of predicted weather.

Planning also means having any prescription medications in advance of the weather. Remember to also have a flashlight, spare batteries, and a supply of drinking water in the event conditions reach that level.

While weather this severe is happening, stay inside. Do not venture outside unless it is absolutely necessary. Hazards may include falling tree limbs and downed electrical lines.

If you do experience an electrical or utility outage, remember to report it immediately to the appropriate utility company. Many citizens fail to report outages out of fear they are 'bothering' the utility companies when they are already busy. Utilities use these outage reports to help pinpoint the cause or location of the problem.

In 2022, our group donated 1215 lbs. of food and personal care items to the Food Pantry!

## Community Service Message from the PSP: Preventing Scams

### **Popular Scams:**

**Phone Scams:** Promise winnings or claim a family member is in trouble.

**Door to Door Scams:** Ask to seal driveway, or fix roof, or claim they are with the power or water company.

**Email Scams:** Promise winnings or prizes, usually provide a link to click on.

### Prevent Scams!!!

Screen calls. Let numbers you don't recognize go to voicemail. Scammers rarely leave a message. Ask questions about the prize or ask basic questions about the family member. Ask to see a business card. Look to see what vehicle they are driving. Ask for company ID. Call your power or water company to see if they are legitimate. Never open emails if you do not recognize the sender. Never click on links within the emails.

### Some Questions to ask:

How much do I have to pay to get my prize? Ask the "family member" basic questions about themselves that only they would know the answer to. Do you have a business card May I see your Company ID card? Do not believe these scammers. If you send money via gift card or electronically, you will never see it again!!!

When in doubt, call 911



### **Red Flags:**



You are asked to send money via gift card or wire transfer. They ask for username/password. They have "extra materials" to do home repairs. There is a time limit on your response.

### News from State Senator John DiSanto

This March, I joined Treasurer Stacy Garrity outside the Finance Building's historic vault to announce the introduction of my Senate Bill 24, which would automate the process of returning unclaimed property to rightful owners.

If enacted, my legislation, known as Pennsylvania Money Match, will authorize Treasury to automatically return singleowner property for living individuals valued up to \$5,000 to the rightful owner after an identification and verification process. At least 14 other states have successfully implemented similar programs to automatically reunite their residents with many millions of dollars in unclaimed property.

My Pennsylvania Money Match proposal will get money to residents faster than ever before as it removes the burden of having to search and submit a claim to recover their property. With more than \$4 billion currently waiting to be claimed and one in ten Pennsylvanians owed unclaimed property, my bipartisan initiative has tremendous potential to get more funds back into owners' hands during this high inflationary time in which every extra dollar helps families make ends meet.

I look forward to working with Treasurer Garrity and my colleagues in the House and Senate on approving this muchneeded improvement to our unclaimed property program so that the Commonwealth may return money as quickly and conveniently as possible to whom it truly belongs.

The West Access Control Point (ACP) or Main Gate, which will be located on Route 934 (Fisher Avenue), has a projected completion date of May 2023. This gate will include a Visitor Control Center and be manned at all hours for access to the post.

### **South Central EMS Resident Memberships**

Since January 1, 2009, all individuals permanently residing in East Hanover Township, Dauphin County, will receive member benefits with South Central EMS, Inc. Listed below are some of the key highlights of membership.

The ambulance membership covers the patient's transport cost for all emergencies. These are medically necessary ambulance services, as allowed under state and federal laws, within the geographic primary response area of South Central Emergency Medical Services, Inc., as provided by Dauphin County Emergency Management Agency.

- Membership benefits are only applicable when South Central EMS, Inc., is the responding/transporting emergency medical services (EMS) unit.
- Membership benefits will not extend to emergency calls that are not medically necessary. Membership benefits will not extend to non-emergency transportation by ambulance and/or wheelchair/litter van.
- South Central EMS, Inc., is permitted to continue fundraising activities with residents of East Hanover Township; including, but not limited to, an annual fund drive mailing.
- Membership will be considered void if a resident utilizes EMS Services and fails to remit insurance payments received. All payments for services rendered shall be submitted to South Central EMS upon receipt.
- According to the Affordable Care Act, all members must have insurance for the Township Membership to be applicable.
- Membership excludes co-pays, co-insurance and/or deductibles as defined by your insurance carrier.

Once upon a time there were ten one-room school houses in East Hanover Township, six located north of new 22/Allentown Blvd. and four on the south side of the highway. Today, two of the school buildings are no longer in existence, two remain as original buildings but are unoccupied and six are now private residences. For more than 60 years, former students of the one-room schools have gathered the second Sunday of June for an alumni reunion. It is a day of fellowship, recollections and refreshments with former classmates. Last year, the One-Room Schoolhouse Alumni Association became a subcommittee of the Historical Society of East Hanover Township. The membership

of the alumni association is declining, as the members get older. The last first graders to attend the one-room schools in the township are now in their late seventies.
